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[Tan \(O\\_O\)](#) is intended as an even cuter or affectionate variant of [-chan](#). It evokes a small child's mispronunciation of that form of address, or baby talk similar to how, for example, a speaker of English might use "widdle" instead of "little" when speaking to a baby.
